Etymology Corner

The word *Easter* has a fascinating origin story, rooted in traditions that predate Christianity. The English term derives from *Eostre* or *Eastre*, the name of a Germanic goddess of spring and dawn. The Venerable Bede, an 8th-century English monk, first documented this connection in his work *De Temporum Ratione*.

Before Christianisation, Anglo-Saxon pagans celebrated Eostre during the month we now call April. This festival honoured renewal and fertility during the spring equinox, marked by symbols of new life that persist today – eggs

and rabbits among them.


When Christianity spread through northern Europe, the celebration of Christ's resurrection conveniently aligned with these existing spring festivities. Missionaries often incorporated local customs into Christian observances to ease conversion, and thus the name *Easter* was adopted for the resurrection feast in English-speaking regions.

Interestingly, most other languages use terms derived from the Hebrew *Pesach* (Passover), such as *Pascua* in Spanish or *Pâques* in French, directly connecting the holiday to its Jewish roots.

Did You Know...?



During medieval times, churches would hold Easter Laughter (Risus Paschalis) services, where priests would tell jokes and amusing stories to celebrate joy after Lent.

The Easter Bunny tradition originated in Germany in the 1700s, where children would make nests for a mythical hare called *Osterhase* to lay coloured eggs in.

The world's most expensive chocolate Easter egg sold for £7,000 in London. It was crafted from Tanzanian chocolate and contained edible gold leaf.

The world's oldest known sewing needle isn't made of metal, but bone. Discovered in Denisova Cave, Siberia, it dates back around 50,000 years.

Before the invention of thread, ancient peoples used animal sinew, plant fibres and even human hair to stitch materials together.

The humble sewing machine was once considered so revolutionary that it sparked riots. In the 1830s, French tailors burned down a factory containing newly invented sewing machines, fearing unemployment.



Make as many 4-letter or longer words as you can. Letters can only be used once per word, and every word must include the middle letter. There's one word that uses all nine letters.


